Marta McDowell discusses: Emily Dickinson's Gardening Life

Come discover the gardener who became a poet. Join us for our annual talk, featuring Marta McDowell discussing Emily Dickinson's life and love of plants and words. This event will be the launch of McDowell's latest book from Timber Press. If the topic has a familiar ring, it is because *Emily Dickinson's Gardening Life* is an expanded, updated, and full-color reworking of her first book, published in 2005 and long out of print.

Spend an entertaining hour learning about the gardening interests of America's most enduring poetic voice. Marta's talk is full of anecdotes and illustrated with gorgeous images of the people, plants and places that Dickinson loved. Emily Dickinson was also a baker, and our afternoon tea will feature treats baked by Cross Estate volunteers.

Marta is a long-time volunteer at the Cross Estate from Chatham, New Jersey. She teaches at The New York Botanical Garden, lectures around the country, and is the author of many books and articles. In May 2019, Marta

was awarded the Garden Club of America's prestigious Sarah Chapman Francis Medal for Outstanding Literary Achievement.

Her favorite topics are authors who garden, including Beatrix Potter and Laura Ingalls Wilder. Marta calls this pursuit "the pen and the trowel," though one of her friends suggested it might also be called "stubborn women who garden."

Talk & Tea: Emily Dickinson's Gardening Life Thursday, September 26, 2019, 1-3 p.m.

Here's another Talk & Tea favorite recipe. I'm sure Emily Dickinson would have loved these! Find out more about her at this year's Talk & Tea on Septembr 26th.

Meringue Cookie Recipe from Doris Crater

Ingredients

- 4 egg whites
- 1
- 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar

1 chocolate chips

Directions

Beat egg whites until almost thick. cup white sugar Add cream of tartar. Add sugar very gradually until egg whites are thick and form peaks. cup semi-sweet, mini Stir in mini chocolate chips. Line 2 cookie sheets with parchment paper. Place very close together, by teaspoon full, onto cookie sheets. You'll want to get entire batch on 2 cookie sheets. Bake at 225°F for 1 hour. Turn the oven off and leave cookie sheets in the oven until completely dry. I make them in the evening and take them out in the morning. Store in an air tight container or they will absorb moisture and get sticky.
