Cross Estate Gardens Plant Sale

We're Delighted to announce the 2021 Cross Estate Gardens Plant Sale!

Spring. Plant sale season. Many of us plan to visit several area plant sales each spring. In 2020, that did not happen. This year, while the Watnong Chapter of the North American Rock Garden Society plant sale at Buck Gardens has been cancelled and the Frelinghuysen Arboretum sale is being held online, we're happy to say that the Cross Estate Gardens Plant Sale will take place in person. Please join us and shop safely:

- All volunteers and all guests must wear face masks while at the Plant Sale.
- To accommodate six-foot distances between tables, the sale will take place under the wisteria-covered pergola and in the Upper Garden (a.k.a. the Rhododendron Garden).
- In order to be able to maintain safe distances, a maximum of 25 guests may shop at a given time.
- The first hour will be reserved for members of the New Jersey Historical Garden Foundation (NJHGF), Cross Estate Gardens.




Postponed from 2020 Cross Estate Gardens Annual Talk & Tea: Jane Hurwitz

Plant Profile: Wisteria sinensis (chinensis) Chinese Wisteria

In 1816, when agents of the East India Company sent wisteria cuttings from China to England, they could never has guessed that this exquisite vine would become an invasive species in NJ.

Cross Estate Gardens (CEG) Volunteer Fred Aufschlager supervises the pruning of the wisteria. "This species is different from the more common Japanese Wisteria in that it climbs in a counterclockwise fashion. Its blossoms also appear all at once, together, around Mothers' Day, whereas the Japanese type blossoms over a period of weeks. The number of leaflets on the leaf is also different.

"I'm not sure when, but the original vines were planted as part of the original plantings."

Fred had been taken by the outstanding wisteria at the Brooklyn Botanic Garden, and around five years ago, he began the project of rehabilitating the wisteria on the CEG pergola. "Ethan [Hogan] and I were experimenting on just pruning once a year instead of twice, but it takes longer to do the one-time prune in the late Fall. July and mid-November was the original pruning cycle I set up. It's a big job no matter what.

"In recent years, I have made air layers and cuttings which have been used to extend the vines on the pergola to its entire length, severely cutting back the Kiwi and some other vines.

"Interestingly, we have one vine which produces white flowers rather than lavender, which we are trying to extend above and across the formal garden entrance."
